Description

Pair of Empire gilt and patinated bronze candelabra - Pierre-Philippe Thomire, Paris, circa 1805-1815

Important and refined pair of Empire-period candelabra in finely cast and chased bronze, combining original mercury gilding with a deep, untouched patina, attributable to the Parisian production of Pierre-Philippe Thomire, the leading bronzier of the Napoleonic era. Each candelabrum is centred by a winged female figure, representing Victory, standing on a gilt globe decorated with a griffin in relief, and supporting a richly ornamented three-light crown with scrolling foliage inspired by classical antiquity.

The composition is distinguished by its balanced proportions, high-quality chasing, and decorative
