Description

Large, solid silver Bordeaux sugar tongs from the late Louis XV period, in the rare shell-patterned pattern. Hallmarks include the charge mark (the initial "BD") and discharge mark (profile mask) for small works in Bordeaux from 1775-81, the guild mark (small crowned B and two dots) for Bordeaux from 1775-76, and the mark of the master silversmith Jacques Roux, who was admitted to practice in Bordeaux in 1767. This large sugar tongs, in a rare model, is in good condition and remarkably hallmarked, with minor scratches from use. A must-have for the discerning collector... An oil cruet by Jacques Roux is in the collection of the Musée des Arts Décoratifs in Bordeaux.
