Description

Small fibula with an oblong head adorned with filigree decoration centered on a red glass cabochon. The relatively narrow circular ring opens onto a straight stem, forming a compact and balanced piece, typical of jewelry from southern Morocco. Low-grade silver, good overall condition, signs of wear, see photos.

South Taznakht, Ouarzazate, Morocco, early 20th century. Dimensions: 9.7 × 3.5 cm. Sold with certificate and invoice from the Ocarina Gallery.*

Shipping costs upon request. South of Ouarzazate, fibulae accompany women's jewelry and contribute to the identity expression of the Taznakht communities. The red cabochon placed in the center, a highly prized element in the region, evokes a protective symbolism and a desire for brilliance to enhance the jewelry.
