Description

Antique solid silver brooch depicting a thistle, an emblematic motif of Art Nouveau, rendered with remarkable naturalism. The finely cut and veined leaves, with their serrated edges and sculptural form, attest to the high quality of the silversmithing. The heart of the flower is adorned with a natural amethyst cabochon, set in a corolla shape, adding a touch of refined color to the whole. The composition, both dynamic and balanced, is fully in keeping with the organic and symbolist aesthetic of the late 19th century. Based on its style, the quality of the chasing, and the choice of the floral motif, this brooch can be attributed to André Kauffer, a jeweler and silversmith renowned for his Art Nouveau silver creations inspired by flora.
