Central Africa, 19th century: Solid wood sculpture, carved from a single block, depicting a stylized anthropomorphic figure supporting a bifurcated upper form suggesting a receptacle, pillar, or totemic symbol. The wood is dark, heavily patinated, with a surface marked by tool use and time, indicating its age. Description: Crouching or kneeling human figure. Raised arms supporting an upper structure. Stylized treatment of the face and body. Upper part carved in a double-volume form (may suggest: a fertility symbol, a ritual vessel, or a totemic motif). Vertical sculpture, conceived as a standalone object or architectural/ritual element. African tribal art (Central Africa). Ritual or symbolic object (support, altar, votive pillar). Ethnographic sculpture intended for ceremonial use or symbolic
