Who was he? Probably a gunsmith active in Paris at the turn of the 17th and 18th centuries. What did he do? He created high-quality, richly decorated flintlock pistols. Characteristics: They are distinguished by their engraved motifs, brass fittings, and grotesque designs on the stock. Production period: Indicated in the name (1680-1725), this specifies the period
