Description

An Art Deco period chandelier, in hammered wrought iron in the style of shagreen, with a central ceiling bowl and three tulip-shaped shades (one with a crack - see photo) in frosted pressed molded glass. Bears the signature Negra on the bowl and the shades, Degué model no. 857 in the manufacturer's catalogue. Electrified, working. Period: circa 1930. Dimensions: height 65 cm, diameter 50 cm. Good condition. Founder and owner of the Degué Art Glass Company in Paris (1926-1939), David Guéron (1892-1950) created the Cristalleries de Compiègne in the early 1920s before settling in Paris in 1926, with a factory on Boulevard Malesherbes as well as a shop where he presented his creations at 41, Avenue de Paris in the 12th arrondissement of the Capital.
