The vase features a cream crackle-glazed body densely covered with gold stippling, creating a textured, shimmering ground. It is painted with overglaze enamels and gilt, depicting scenes of daily life with figures in traditional kimono, juxtaposed with a serene landscape panel. The attention to detail in the facial expressions and the textile patterns is indicative of high-quality export ware intended for Western collectors.
