Here is a 19th-century graphoscope, or enlarger. This device was invented and patented in 1864 by Charles John Rowsell. It was used to improve the viewing of photographs. It features a folding magnifying glass and a photo holder and is a vintage collector's item. In good condition, with two minor imperfections. The magnifying glass has a burn hole; therefore, be careful not to expose it to direct sunlight. This hole can be repaired, but it also adds to its period charm.
