Description

This vase is a work by Émile Gallé, a great French glass master and a major figure of the École de Nancy, an emblematic movement of Art Nouveau (late 19th - early 20th century). Height: approximately 47 cm, a slender and elegant shape, typical of prestigious decorative pieces. Technique: multi-layered glass (double-layered glass), decorated by acid etching. This technique consists of layering several colored glass layers, then partially removing the upper layers to reveal the designs. Decoration: naturalistic plant motifs (ears of wheat, grasses, foliage), a theme dear to Gallé, inspired by nature and botany. Colors: a subtle gradient ranging from dark green at the base to lighter, yellowish and opalescent tones at the top, creating an effect of depth and light. Signature: the "Gallé" signature, usually engraved
