



## Rare Batak Equestrian Bronze Statuette - Sumatra, 19th Century

### Description

Striking ritual bronze sculpture depicting a mounted rider on horseback, cast using the traditional lost-wax technique. This piece originates from the Batak culture of North Sumatra, Indonesia.

The figure is characterized by a powerful stylized form: an elongated human face with pronounced features, a compact and expressive rider, and a solid, stocky horse. The surface shows a deep, uneven old patina with visible wear consistent with age and ritual handling, confirming its authenticity.

Such sculptures were used within ritual or symbolic contexts, often associated with protection, authority, or ancestral power in Batak society.
