The frame is particularly remarkable: a wide border adorned with a rich polychrome floral design, punctuated by flowers, foliage, and decorative motifs, which underscores the elegance and finesse of the weaving. The color palette, both soft and contrasting, testifies to the exceptional skill of the Aubusson weavers and the quality of the wools used. With its generous dimensions (2.05 × 1.45 m), this tapestry is a striking decorative piece, ideal for enhancing a classic interior or adding a touch of authenticity and poetry to a refined setting. It is fully in keeping with the tradition of the great Aubusson productions of the 19th century, combining technical mastery with narrative charm.
