Description

Portrait of a Man - French School, second half of the 18th century. Oil on canvas depicting a half-length portrait of a man, shown in three-quarter view, his gaze directed towards the viewer. The sitter wears a powdered wig tied back, a dark coat, and a light satin waistcoat with a white jabot, in keeping with the fashion of the second half of the 18th century. The neutral background, deliberately devoid of decoration, emphasizes the presence and expression of the face. The flesh tones are rendered with care, precise modeling, and a restrained palette, characteristic of commissioned civilian portraits intended for a bourgeois or administrative clientele. An anonymous work, belonging to a European school, probably French or Northern European, datable to around 1760-1785. The
