DRUM MAJOR'S SABER, MODEL 1822, MODIFIED UNDER THE JULY MONARCHY. France, 19th century, dated May 1823. Steel, brass, horn. Total length: 101cm - Blade length: 78.8cm. Slightly curved blade, hollow-edged, with one cutting edge and one counter-cutting edge, flat back marked: Manuf Ral de Klingenthal May 1823; two control stamps on the right side. Handle in copper filigree horn. Crossguard in gilded brass, with the Great Arms of France in the center, now faded; the ends of the quillons are smooth; the smooth back is stamped CP under a crown. Short skirted cap, chiseled with flowers, acanthus leaves, palmettes, and rosettes, with a lion's head on the lid. Gilded brass scabbard, with four cutouts on the front, trimmed with four richly decorated gilded brass plates; the

first features a shako with a plume and musical instruments on a leafy background; the other three are decorated with flowers, foliage, and acanthus leaves. They are framed by reinforced brass bands with a laurel leaf frieze. The upper part is flanked by two hanging hooks. The lower part, in gilded brass, features a lion's head surmounting a ring engraved with heart rays and placed above a strong trefoil sting, decorated with flowers and palmettes. The back is smooth except for the three bracelets, and is marked Manceaux à Paris. Good overall condition, with signs of wear. Ref.: 6606
