Auguste Moreau was the son of the sculptor Jean-Baptiste-Louis-Joseph Moreau and the younger brother of the sculptors Hippolyte Moreau and Mathurin Moreau. He learned sculpture from his older brother Mathurin. He debuted at the Salon of 1861 and continued to play an active role at the Salon des Artistes

His favorite subjects--allegories, putti, Cupid--are treated with realism and grace. Auguste was the only one of his siblings not to have received an official award. He is buried in the municipal cemetery of Les Lilas. Auguste Moreau primarily produced bronze art sculptures.
