Description

A combination gun of the Bayet Frères model, unsigned and highly prized in the 19th century, consists of a pinfire revolver and a hinged dagger fixed under the barrel. The revolver has an open frame. It features an octagonal barrel and a trigger guardless mechanism that folds under the frame for easy pocketing. The cylinder has six 7mm chambers. Ammunition is fed through a side gate held in place by an internal spring. The metal ramrod slides in a guide integrated into the frame and is held by a small leaf spring. The grip consists of a metal frame covered with two carved walnut buttstocks secured by a through screw. The weapon is engraved with foliage. It bears the inscription "Acier Fondu" (Cast Steel) and an "O" surmounted by a star. The revolver is 19 cm long. The dagger blade is the sole subject

of Bayet's patent, as the pinfire revolver is largely inspired by the Lefaucheux system. This straight, double-edged blade is fixed under the revolver's barrel. A push-button system releases the blade from the spring attached to the rear of the support, pivots it forward on the hinge, and folds it along the barrel. This spring also secures the blade in the open position. The weapon is approximately 27 cm long when open. It comes in its original case with its key. Dimensions: 23 x 13 cm, height 5.5 cm. The entire piece is in very good condition, and the mechanism is in very good condition. A 19th-century piece. Category "D". A collector's item.
