### Description

Pair of large Chinese vases dating from the late 19th century, made of ceramic and adorned with a refined decoration characteristic of the Chinese tradition, combining symbolic motifs with a rich chromatic palette. In 1955, these vases were converted into lamps by the Maldora house, a renowned Parisian workshop located at 112 rue Jouffroy in Paris, specializing in the adaptation and enhancement of antique works of art. This transformation is part of a 20th-century tradition that sought to integrate historical pieces into contemporary use while respecting their original character and authenticity. The addition of a carefully executed electrical system and lampshades emphasizes the volumes and decorative details of the vases, creating a dialogue between 19th-century Chinese
