Rare wall tapestry in wool and silk, woven at the Aubusson Manufactory in the 18th century, depicting a genre scene emblematic of the Age of Enlightenment: the consultation of a fortune teller.

The composition features a group of finely dressed figures gathered around the fortune teller as she interprets the lines of a hand. The scene unfolds beneath a large central tree that structures the composition, set against a refined architectural backdrop evoking a classical town or aristocratic estate. The presence of an animal and a child enhances the narrative and symbolic dimension of the work, reflecting the 18th century's fascination with destiny, curiosity, and
