A true symbol of social status, they are generally found in the tombs of the wealthy and powerful, as well as the imperial family. This Tang horse is inspired by this glorious era and its traditions, adapted to 19th-century tastes, where ceramics gave way to bone carving, as seen here with buffalo bone. Its posture is that of a proud and robust warrior
