An interesting and charming sepia ink drawing, dating from the late 19th or early 20th century, depicting a seascape with a large sailing ship... The work is signed in the lower left corner with the studio sale stamp of the renowned painter Félix Ziem (1821-1911), to whom the Bénézit dictionary devotes a significant chapter and whose biography can be found on Wikipedia: his biography is essential reading, as he was a celebrated artist who began his career alongside the forerunners of the Barbizon School, notably becoming friends with Théodore Rousseau and Jean-François Millet... A great traveler, he produced magnificent landscapes of the Orient that brought him fame... He achieved recognition and glory from 1865 onwards, counting among his art dealers the famous Durand-Ruel... Ziem
