Creation of the renowned sculptor & ceramist artist François Levallois (1882-1965) during the Art Deco period (1910-1939), the artist represented a pair of wolves or wolf-dogs in a tenacious and adventurous posture. The one in front looks into the distance, watches for his pack while resting, the one in the back protects the rear of the one in front. They are accomplices and protect each other in this wild environment (the terrace symbolizing a rocky plateau) and the grass behind symbolizing nature. The wolf, this wild animal symbolizes pack spirit and family solidarity, mixed with a wild and indomitable spirit. In very
