Creation of the Japanese ceramist artisans of Kutani-Yaki in the prefecture of Ishikawa in Japan in the 19th century, this vase is recognizable by its coral red color, characteristic. The peculiarity of this vase is its geometric shape and its three scenes: two scenes of nature with birds from the breed of robin flying away from a flowering bush of peonies and a central one, that of a moment in the Japanese imperial court where Aristocrats are having a hobby, most certainly music, under a Japanese maple tree. The beauty of this vase is entirely handmade, demonstrating the craftsmanship prowess of the artisans of the Meiji period.
