Description

Engler - Hunting Scene. Oil on canvas, signed. A 19th-century painter, signed Engler, active around 1870-1880, specializing in animal and genre painting (dogs, horses, rural scenes), mentioned in art dictionaries (Akoun, Benezit) and represented in public collections such as that of the Clamecy Museum. This elegant oil on canvas, signed Engler, depicts a hunting scene imbued with calm and distinction. The artist portrays riders gathered on horseback, accompanied by their hounds, in a subtly rendered and profound forest landscape. The composition emphasizes balance and restraint: the carefully drawn figures stand out naturally in a hushed atmosphere, evoking a moment of pause or gathering before the hunt. The rendering of the horses, with their accurate and nuanced poses, demonstrates a true

mastery of the subject, while the palette, dominated by muted and harmonious tones, lends the whole a timeless elegance.
