Dogon Nommo statue in brown patina bronze with red highlights in the middle of the 20th century. What if you let the beauty of African art from the Dogon West, within your interior? Rare and spectacular, this bronze sculpture with its particular shape evokes that of a Nommo, water spirit of the Dogon cosmogony. First being created by the god Amma, the Nommo is an entity with human and aquatic animal characteristics, symbol of life and universal fertility. The Nommo is a hermaphroditic deity both male (male) & female (breast), and animal (here the crocodile with pointed scales on the back), which makes it a rare subject among the Nommo, making the connection between land and water. This mixture of two opposites makes it the embodiment of the balance of what

everything opposes in nature: earth and water,
day and night, order and chaos!Creation of the
Dogon peoples in the middle of the 20th century,
this bronze sculpture is made using the lost wax
technique: a mold is shaped, the interior filled
with wax and the molten metal is poured into it.
The mold is then destroyed, making each of the
productions of the Dogon people a unique work
of art. The patina between brown, ochre and gold
is endemic to Dogon productions of the mid-20th
