As per tradition, it is represented here by a beautiful and proud female figure symbolizing the cardinal virtue of strength, armed with the attributes that evoke it, holding a shield and sword. Heightening the sense of great power and courage, the shield features the image of a rampant lion, the animal considered the classic emblem of strength. The vermilion red of the robes, always associated with passion and blood, is a further sign of great vigor and stands out vividly, with excellent results on the canvas. The work certainly conveyed a
