Each figure is sculpted with remarkable attention to detail, capturing their joyful expressions and iconic symbolic attributes, such as the fan or staff. The work is distinguished by its nuanced patina, ranging from cream to golden brown, which highlights the depth of the carvings. The stylized waves at the base of the ship lend exceptional dynamism to the whole. Beneath the base, the artist's signature, Hogetsu (?), can be seen, attesting to the authenticity and craftsmanship of this collector's item.
