A pivotal period in design (1890-1910), Art Nouveau is an artistic, architectural, and decorative movement whose design principles are inspired by natural themes and the "perfect" forms of nature. This return to the source allows for true design gems, even for common objects derived from folk art, like this candy dish. It combines the practicality of the material: the brass elegantly elevates and highlights the turquoise blue blown glass body, which can hold sugared almonds or candies (today, it could serve as a jewelry box). The absolute beauty of this candy dish lies in its body adorned with floral motifs and gilded butterflies,
