



Rondot: Rare 18th Century Solid Silver Platter With Coat Of Arms Of The Count Of Troyes 1777-78

Description

Extremely rare heavy round Troyes dish in solid silver from the 18th century, with a bordered rim. The rim is engraved with magnificent period coats of arms surmounted by a count's coronet. Two small engravings are located on the back edge, "DMV" and "LM". Charge mark (numeral "RS") and discharge mark (crozier) of the Reims jurisdiction 1781-89, Troyes mint mark, Troyes guild mark 1777-78 (crowned E), and the mark of master silversmith Jacques Rondot (mark with the letters "RONDOT" on two lines, a knight's cross above, and a small fleur-de-lis below), registered in 1748. Extremely rare heavy Troyes armorial platter in very good condition and remarkably hallmarked, with minor scratches from use. An exceptional silversmith, a platter by Jacques Rondot is in the Metropolitan Museum of Art in
