Description

Superb pair of large cabinet armchairs in carved mahogany, mahogany veneer, and black-patinated beechwood. The backs feature a wide openwork crest rail finely carved with a trellis motif. The armrests are carved with lion heads, the front legs are in a hocked (jarret) form, and the rear legs are sabre-shaped. The openwork composition of the back is strictly identical to that of a set supplied by Jacob Frères, unstamped, in 1800 for the Tuileries Palace, later installed in 1807 at Fontainebleau in a dining room of the Princes' apartment.
