Description

The painting is distinguished by its rich, textured, and vibrant brushwork, characteristic of European painting between Impressionism and Post-Impressionism, with a luminous chromatic range. The floral still life is enclosed in a beautiful small carved wooden frame, original and contemporary to the artwork.
