Description

A large and beautiful 19th-century painting executed in the pure style of the Barbizon School animal painters, depicting a rural landscape with a ram and sheep in a meadow. The work is signed by the painter François Simon (1818-1896), an excellent artist born in Marseille, to whom the Bénézit dictionary dedicates a chapter. He was a student of the renowned Émile Loubon and debuted at the Salon of 1853. In 1855, he participated in the Universal Exhibition. His works are held in several museums, including those in Pontoise, Saint-Étienne, and Strasbourg. Note: he is the kind of artist whose work can be collected "without breaking the bank," as his paintings have remained affordable compared to those of artists of his generation, such as Gustave Courbet (1819-1877), Théodore Rousseau
