Description

Regency Period Armchair - Louis XV Transition. This very elegant Regency period armchair, foreshadowing the Louis XV style, is made of carved wood and remarkable for the finesse of its decoration and the balance of its proportions. The chair rests on cabriole legs, known as "shell" legs, joined by a three-cross stretcher forming an X, characteristic of early 18th-century pieces, ensuring both stability and elegance. The shaped apron is richly adorned with a carved oak leaf motif, a symbol of strength and permanence, finely executed with deep and vibrant relief. The delicately curved armrests terminate in carved cuffs, demonstrating meticulous craftsmanship and great technical skill. The violin-shaped back features pronounced antique caning with a beautiful patina, harmonizing with the antique

caning of the seat, lending the piece a rare authenticity. The wood, with its warm and even patina, highlights the quality of the carving and the natural elegance of the piece. This armchair perfectly illustrates the Regency period, a transitional moment when the rigor of the Louis XIV style softened to herald the grace and dynamism of Louis XV. A piece of character, ideal for a classic interior, a library, or a living room, but also perfectly at home in a contemporary setting, where it will bring nobility and historical depth. This chair has been restored several times and is fitted with a removable red fabric cushion, providing additional seating comfort while respecting the piece's aesthetic.
