A pair of mercury-gilt bronze candlesticks, matte and burnished with agate, by the bronze worker Claude Galle. The flat, circular base is bordered by a gadrooned frieze and a central gadrooned rosette. The baluster-shaped stem is decorated with palmettes. The candle holder is vase-shaped, and both the holders and the drip pans are decorated with gadroons. An elegant and understated model. Weight: 1750 grams. Height: 27 cm. Base diameter: 13 cm. Period: Early Empire period ,circa 1806/1807. Condition report: Candlesticks in excellent condition, with thick, original mercury gilding. Minor wear in places on the base of one of the candlesticks.
