Description

An important pair of ceremonial solid silver candelabra with three lights plus a central one. With a slender and majestic silhouette, each candelabra rests on a richly molded circular base supporting a tall, faceted stem, entirely chased with scrolls, cartouches, and neoclassical motifs. The shaft is adorned with finely modeled, raised female masks framed by garlands and stylized foliage, giving the whole a remarkable sculptural presence. The elegantly curved arms extend with balance and symmetry, highlighted by fluting and scrolls, and supporting gadrooned candle holders. The whole piece testifies to the goldsmith's virtuosity, combining decorative richness with perfect harmony of proportions. A rare pair, ideal for collectors of French silverware and lovers of large decorative pieces. Dimensions: Height 54
