Description

Médéric Mieusement (1840-1905) Spire of Notre-Dame de Paris, circa 1892. Albumen print. Bears the inscription "Paris, Cathedral, taken from the South Tower (882)" in the lower right corner. Image size: 38.8 x 28.5 cm. Framed size: 55 x 45 cm. Reference: French Ministry of Culture, Heritage and Photography Media Library. The spire of Notre-Dame de Paris was designed in the 19th century by Eugène Viollet-le-Duc during the major restoration of the cathedral beginning in 1844. The old medieval spire having been dismantled in 1786, the architect proposed a new one inspired by the Gothic style of the 13th century. Inaugurated in 1859, it measured approximately 96 meters high. Constructed of wood and covered in lead, it was surrounded by statues of the twelve apostles. This
