Felt hat, 25 cm high at the front, 31 cm high at the back, and 8.5 cm high at the curve. It is trimmed at the front with gold braid and held in place by a gilt brass uniform button stamped with the number "47" sewn onto the hat. Large tricolor and silver braid cockade on the outside, then red and blue; 7.5 cm in diameter. The interior lining consists of a 5 cm high waxed black leather band and black silk trim. Dimensions: width 49.5 cm; height 37 cm; depth 14 cm. Small lens-shaped pompom for a bicorne hat with the number "6", 6th company. Good condition. France. First Empire. Historical note: Campaign in Spain from 1807 to 1814; 1812 Salamanca; 1813 Victoria; Pamplona; Orthez and Toulouse 1814. German Campaign May 1, 1813 to November 1813. Battles of Lutzen, Bautzen, and Leipzig.
