Description

Decor of acanthus with plants chiseled from the front. Scalloped edges with a clasp-shaped foliage motif. Silver, net weight: 108.5 g. Minerva 1st standard hallmark (1838 to 1919). Maker's mark, partially erased but probably PQ: QUEILLE family - an antique oar. Minor scratches from use. Good overall condition. Dimensions: Length: 24.5 cm, Width: 6.5 cm, Height: 0.5 cm. A large family of 19th-century silversmiths established for nearly a century. On February 11, 1847, Eugène registered his hallmark, which he had inherited from his grandfather and his father, Pierre François Queillé père (hence the initials PQ), and worked at 8 rue Saint Roch Poissonnière in Paris. In 1874, the workshops moved to 11 rue des Petits-Carreux, and his son Elvire worked with him, using his hallmark, until 1880.
