Illustrations by Job. Jacques Onfroy de Bréville, known as Job, was a French draftsman, caricaturist, and illustrator, born in 1858 in Bar-le-Duc and died in 1931 in Neuilly-sur-Seine. His artist's name, "Job," is composed of the initial of his given name, Jacques, and those of his surname, Onfroy de Bréville. His most renowned books include Murat, The Great Napoleon for Little Children, Let's Play History, Louis XI, Napoleon,
