A very fine pair of antique polychrome turned wood armchairs from the northern Indian subcontinent, attributable to Rajasthan or the Punjab region (India/Pakistan), dating from the late 19th to early 20th century. These armchairs feature a turned wood frame with architectural forms, characteristic of regional craft production, combining European formal influences with traditional hand-painted decoration. The uprights, backs, and armrests are composed of numerous turned balusters, painted bright red, enhanced with black and white floral and geometric motifs, creating a rich and contrasting polychromy. The well-proportioned and robust turned legs ensure excellent stability. The woven plant fiber seats provide a natural
