Remarkable marquetry work in a frieze pattern, with a geometric lozenge design. Its curved uprights are adorned with corner mounts decorated with female masks and foliate scrolls extending to the sabots. Beautiful and rich ornamentation of gilt and chased bronze, such as the mounts, lamp brackets, sabots, keyhole escutcheons, movable drawer pulls, and masks.
