Description

Necklace composed of tubular, circular, and discoidal beads in turquoise blue faience, punctuated by six miniature scarabs, one of which bears an inscription on its reverse, and centered with an amulet depicting a Djed pillar. The piece is distinguished by the harmony of its proportions and the sustained brilliance of the glaze. Necklace made up of older elements assembled later.

Turquoise blue glazed faience, slight surface wear, signs of age, see photos. Egypt, Late Period and Ptolemaic Period (c. 664-332 BC / 332-30 BC). Dimensions: Diameter: approx. 14 cm. Djed pillar: 2.6 cm. Scarabs: approx. 1.1 to 1.2 cm.

This type of adornment, both radiant and laden with meaning, extends into daily life an essential idea of ancient Egypt: protection, strength, and immortality."
