Description

A pair of five-flame winged Victory candelabra. Empire style. Attributed to Pierre-Philippe Thomire (1751-1843). Finely chased gilt bronze with a black patina. The central body is in the form of Nike Canefora resting on a globe. The arms are designed as cornucopias surrounding a central torch. The rectangular bases are made of malachite; their decoration features a gilt bronze crown containing a star (the symbol of Moscow) and adorned with quivers and ribbons. There is a strong resemblance to the preparatory drawing by Charles Percier (1746-1838) created for the decoration of Josephine Bonaparte's boudoir (Paris, 1802) and to the winged Victory candelabra signed by Thomire (Paris, 1810) now in the Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York.
