

Description

This monumental canvas by Gundi Falk is distinguished by its graphic power and formal balance. Shades of gray, applied in washes, create depth and rhythm, while a network of fine lines animates the surface and reinforces the visual dynamism. The overall effect oscillates

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between abstraction and organic evocation. With its vertical format of 140 × 100 cm, the artwork possesses a strong architectural presence and naturally becomes a focal point in a contemporary interior or professional space. Artist Biography: Born in 1966 in Salzburg, Austria, Gundi Falk develops a practice situated at the intersection of painting and experimental photography. She is particularly recognized for her research on chemigram, conducted in collaboration with Pierre Cordier. Her work explores matter, time, and the processes of transformation, asserting a coherent approach between abstraction and formal experimentation. Since the late 1990s, she has participated in numerous international exhibitions.
