Description Oil on canvas depicting a scene from the Stations of the Cross, probably the Third Station: Jesus falls for the first time. Christ, haloed and crowned with thorns, collapses under the weight of the cross. His body, draped in a pink cloak, expresses surrender and suffering. At his side, Simon of Cyrene appears to be assisting him, while armed Roman soldiers frame the scene. The composition is dynamic, organized around the powerful diagonal formed by the cross. The figures are rendered with clarity and academic precision, with well-defined volumes and a vibrant palette typical of religious works from the late 18th and early 19th centuries. The
