Description

French Drawing -- Second Empire Period
19th century (1852-1870)

Charming 19th-century French drawing from the Second Empire period, depicting a narrative interior scene.

The composition presents three figures within a domestic setting: a man leaning toward a reclining woman, while a third figure observes the interaction. The lively, assured line constructs the scene with remarkable economy of means, privileging expression and gesture over decorative elaboration.

The work reflects the mid-19th-century taste for intimate genre scenes inspired by bourgeois life. It balances social observation with subtle

narrative suggestion, rendered in a sensitive and elegant manner.

Its small scale -- 10 × 14.5 cm -- enhances the intimate character of the piece. This is a cabinet drawing, meant to be viewed closely, where the spontaneity of the line reveals the immediacy of the artist's hand.
