Description

Japanese silk painting Meiji period, female figure in antique kimono with red obi, 31 x 38 cm

Japanese painting on silk applied to a wooden panel, depicting a female figure seen from behind walking along a path toward a house with a thatched roof.

She wears a traditional Japanese garment, an early form of kimono (kosode), tied at the waist with a wide red obi decorated with subtle gold motifs and arranged in a large bow at the back. The circular patterns and restrained gilded details stand out gently against a palette dominated by soft browns and warm beige tones. The figure holds a travel staff (tsue), suggesting a scene of movement or quiet journey.
