Professor at the School of Applied Arts, Capron was initially interested in drawing. He discovered ceramics in Vallauris before Picasso and founded the Callis workshop with Robert Picault. He established his own workshop in 1952 and sold his collections, notably in the United States at the Saks Fifth Avenue department store. He received awards at numerous international exhibitions in Milan, Brussels, Cannes, and elsewhere. From 1963 onwards, he gradually abandoned shaped
