Description

This hunting cutting set is in very good condition. It is probably from British origin, due to the inscription "Cast Steel" on the sharpening tool. It is probably a Sheffield production, dating from the late 19th or very early 20th century. While cutting sets for leg of lamb were not uncommon in the 1870s-1900s, the vast majority were of rather poor quality. Our example stands out for its quality and its strong hunting-related style. The three pieces are mounted identically, with a stag horn handle and ferrules made of white metal (silver? nickel silver? - no hallmark visible) decorated with embossed geometric patterns. The knife blade is single-edged and has the characteristic silhouette of German and British game knives of that period. The fork has two tines and a small pivoting section to hold the meat
