Description

A porcelain dish with a scalloped rim, the molded edge is covered with a pale celadon green glaze. The center, framed by a double blue band, features an underglaze blue decoration depicting a stylized landscape of rocks and leaves (pines, bamboo, and maples). Around 1750, the wares produced in Imari--the main port for the export of Arita porcelain--frequently combined blue and white decoration, polychrome enamels, or, more rarely, monochrome glazes like this celadon. This pale green hue, obtained with an iron-rich glaze fired in a reducing atmosphere, is inspired by Chinese celadons and was prized for its softness and refinement. Carefully packaged.
