This bronze okimono-style sculpture depicts a crow (karasu in Japanese) perched on an old, cracked tree trunk. In Japanese culture, the crow symbolizes wisdom, longevity, love, and children's gratitude towards their parents. The feathers are crafted with extraordinary precision - a masterful chiseling (finishing the details after casting) is evident. The realism of the tree trunk (bark texture, knots) contrasts perfectly with the softness of the feathers. Japan, Meiji era (1868-1912). Signature to identify.
